## Natural Gas Pre-Winter Check

FOLLOW THESE TIPS TO KEEP YOUR HOME FUNCTIONING SAFELY AND EFFICIENTLY

#### LOWER THE TEMP, LOWER YOUR BILL

Set the thermostat at 68 degrees or below to save energy and money. Installing a programmable thermostat can also help regulate your usage.

#### HOME ON THE **RANGE & DRYER**

With holiday guests in town, your stove and dryer might be doing more work than usual. Removing excess buildup from both of these appliances is a good habit.

#### **FURNISH YOUR FURNACE**

Have your furnace checked by a professional to ensure the pilot light and burners are working properly. Change the filter regularly.

#### **PUT HEAT IN** ITS PLACE AND KEEP IT THERE

Seal air leaks with caulking and weather stripping to keep warm air in and cold air out. Pay close attention to openings around windows and doors. Also, make sure your attic is properly insulated.

## MAKE ROOM FOR SPACE HEATERS

Keep space heaters away from anything flammable. do not use unapproved heaters indoors to prevent carbon monoxide poisoning.

#### YOUR FIREPLACE SHOULD BE A SAFE PLACE

Thoroughly inspect the fireplace before starting a traditional fire or igniting gas logs.

#### **DETECT YOUR DETECTORS**

Make sure the carbon monoxide and smoke detectors are working properly and have adequate battery life.

## **GATE Card Expiration Approaching**

The Georgia Agriculture Tax Exemption (GATE) is a certificate issued by the Georgia Department of Agriculture that identifies its user as a qualified farmer or producer who is exempt from sales tax on the inputs used in the production of their commodity.

If you are currently receiving a GATE sales tax exemption for gas purchased from Walton EMC, your card will expire Dec. 31, 2016. To continue receiving this exemption, you need to re-apply for the GATE certificate by the end of the year.



### Pecan Crescent Cookies

1 cup butter at room temperature

½ cup confectioner's sugar

- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 cup pecans or walnuts, finely chopped
- 1 \( \frac{4}{2} \) cup all-purpose flour

Extra confectioner's sugar for coating cookie

Beat confectioner's sugar, butter and vanilla with electric mixer in a large bowl until fluffy. Add nuts and mix well until blended. Gradually, beat in flour until well blended. Wrap dough and chill for at least 2 hours.

Heat oven to 325 degrees. On a lightly floured board, roll each piece into  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch thick rope and cut into  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch length. Bend into crescent shapes and taper end.

Place on ungreased cookie sheets about an inch apart. Bake 12 to 15 minutes until light golden. While warm, roll in confectioner's sugar and cool on racks.

Makes about 100 cookies.
