GEORGIA COMMUNITIES HOST FREE OUTDOOR CONCERTS THIS SUMMER

Temperatures aren't the only thing heating up in Georgia over the summer. The outdoor music scene is hot with free concerts happening in parks and venues throughout the state. A few of these events are weekend festivals, but most are concert series that have become summertime traditions.

Walton Gas is a sponsor of **AthFest Music & Arts Festival**, happening June 23–25 in downtown Athens. This annual event features live music by local and regional artists from a variety of genres. The festival includes three outdoor stages as well as a block-long artisan market and a KidsFest area.

Enjoy music under the stars as the **Atlanta Symphony Orchestra (ASO)** presents two concerts in Atlanta's Piedmont Park. At the **Summer Porch Jam 2023** on June 16 in Old Town Suwanee, musicians play outdoors at multiple venues from 6 to 10 p.m. Music lovers are urged to bring a chair or blanket and stroll from venue to venue, enjoying a variety of musicians.

Broccoli & Tuna Casserole

INGREDIENTS

1 cup broccoli
1/2 cup mayonnaise
1 can tuna
1/2 cup crackers
1 can cream of chicken soup

INSTRUCTIONS

Boil broccoli for 10 minutes. Drain and arrange in shallow baking dish. Cover with tuna. Mix soup and mayonnaise, then pour over tuna. Sprinkle crackers on top. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes.
