Visiting a museum is a great way to get out of the scorching heat on a July afternoon. It's even more enjoyable when you can do it for free.

To help you plan a cool getaway, Walton Gas has compiled a list of Georgia museums you can visit at no cost anytime or on certain days. Here are five favorites from the lengthy list shared this month on our blog at wالتongas.com/walton-wise.

Jimmy Carter Presidential Library and Museum • Atlanta

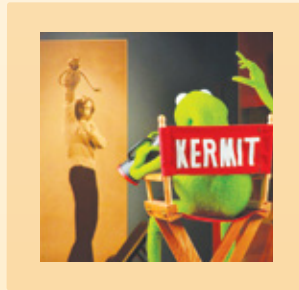
Explore the legacy of the nation's 39th president, and the only Georgian ever to be president. Kids 16 and younger are always admitted free, however there is an admission cost for adults and seniors.

High Museum of Art • Atlanta

The largest museum for visual art in the Southeastern U.S. offers free admission on the second Sunday of each month from noon to 5 p.m. with special family programming. Visitors must have a reservation and a timed ticket to enter.

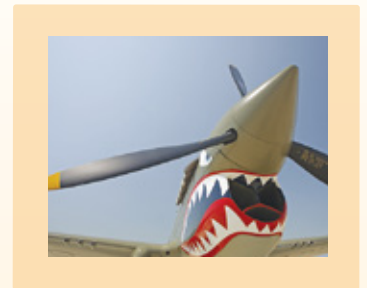
Worlds of Puppetry Museum • Atlanta

Fans of the Muppets and "Sesame Street" will especially enjoy getting a behind-the-scenes look at the Jim Henson creations that reside at this museum spotlighting all things puppetry. Georgia public library cardholders can reserve up to four free passes to the museum.



Museum of Aviation • Warner Robbins

Admission is free for all at the second largest museum in the U.S. Air Force. The 51-acre facility includes four climate-controlled exhibit buildings housing 85 historic U.S. Air Force aircraft, missiles, cockpits and exhibits.



Booth Western Art Museum • Cartersville

Visit the world's largest permanent exhibition space for Western art – in paintings, sculpture, photography and artifacts – for free from 4–8 p.m. on the first Thursday of each month. The museum is a Smithsonian Institution affiliate.

gas up the stove

Southern Georgia Macaroni Coleslaw

INGREDIENTS

1 package (7 ounces) ring macaroni
1 package (14 ounces) coleslaw mix
2 medium onions, finely chopped
2 celery ribs, finely chopped
1 medium cucumber, finely chopped
1 medium green pepper, finely chopped
1 can (8 ounces) whole water chestnuts, drained & chopped (optional)

DRESSING

1 1/2 cups Miracle Whip
1/3 cup sugar
1/4 cup apple cider vinegar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper

INSTRUCTIONS

Cook the macaroni according to package directions; drain and rinse pasta in cold water. Transfer to a large bowl; add coleslaw mix, onions, celery, cucumber, green pepper and water chestnuts. In a small bowl, whisk the dressing ingredients. Pour over salad; toss to coat. Cover and refrigerate for at least 1 hour.
